The Curriculum Developer will assist language experts in the creation of curricula and teaching materials for teaching the Dakota language through topic-based modules. The Curriculum Developer will work as a team with other individuals under the Kaksiza Caŋhdeśka Center for Dakota Linguistics, funded by a NSF TEA Center grant. The goal of the Kaksiza Caŋhdeśka Center is to support an extensive network of Dakota language teachers by producing language resources and instructional materials that follow a culturally relevant topic-based approach.

Responsibilities and duties for the Curriculum Developer include:

- Designing high-quality, professional instructional resources and classroom materials that utilize
 a culturally relevant topic-based methodology (stemming from Content-Based Language
 Teaching), able to be distributed to and used by Dakota language teachers;
- Working with department language specialists and first-language speakers to ensure accurate and thorough Dakota language content for a variety of specialized contexts;
- Leading the process of topic-based language curriculum production from start to finish, from exploration and selection of topics relevant to Dakota culture and communities, to the publication and distribution of teachers' resources and teaching materials;
- Adjusting topics and materials for a variety of target age groups, from elementary student to adult-aged learners;
- Working with the team's language instructors to train language teachers from other language institutions and communities in the use of Kaksiza Caŋhdeska's topic-based Dakota language curriculum during workshops hosted by Kaksiza Caŋhdeska;
- Continuously improve Kaksiza Caŋhdeśka's materials by incorporating community and language instructor feedback;
- Other duties necessary for meeting goals of the Center.
